

Biorefinery in FP6 (2002-2006) ENERGY Theme

- **✓** No specific calls on Biorefinery
- ✓ However, calls on biofuels were generally open to biorefinery concepts
- **✓** 2 biorefinery projects funded :
 - BIOSYNERGY (1st generation) Integrated Project
 - BIOCOUP (2nd generation) Integrated Project
 - ~ 7,3 M€/ project



Biorefinery in FP7 (2006-2013) ENERGY theme

- ✓ FP7-ENERGY-2007-1-RTD → First call including Biorefinery topics:
 - New uses for glycerine in biorefineries (CP, "limited" biorefinery concept optimising use of side-product glycerine) → 3 projects:
 - GLYFINERY
 - PROPANERGY

>~ 2,6 M €/ project


- SUPERMETHANOL
- □ Developing biorefinery concepts (CSA, biorefinery schemes to be integrated into existing industrial complexes) → 2 projects:
 - SUSTOIL
 - BIOREF-INTEG

>~ 1 M €/ project



Biorefinery-related projects in FP7 (2006-2013) ALL THEMES

>ca 182 M €in 2007 and 2008

Biorefinery in FP7 (2006-2013)

- ✓ **Joint call FP7-2009-BIOREFINERY:** first truly interdisciplinary and cross-sectoral biorefinery call:
 - ■2 DGs involved (RTD, TREN)
 - 4 FP7 themes:
 - Food, agriculture and fisheries, and biotechnology
 - Nanosciences, nanotechnologies, materials and new production technologies
 - Energy
 - Environment (including climate change)



Biorefinery in FP7 (2006-2013)

- ✓ Aims at the research, development and integration of innovative technologies to prove the viability of advanced biorefineries taking into account the entire value chain and sustainability issues
- ✓ Two topics / Two Instruments / Two Budgets
 - Collaborative Project (CP) « Sustainable Biorefineries » € 55 M
 - Co-ordination and Support Action (CSA) « Enhancing exchange of information, synergies and cross-fertilization between projects in the field of Biorefineries » € 2 M
